Opening Keynote: evening of Thursday, March 26th by Professor Mariano J. Aznar-Gómez, **Treasure hunters, sunken State vessels and the 2001 UNESCO Convention**

The Conference will also explore some of these issues:

- The problem of looting in Egypt and Cambodia, the legal context and response;
- The legal framework for emergency responses to heritage destruction in times of conflict, particularly focusing on the case of Syria;
- Legal responsibilities and due diligence in relation to provenance research and acquisitions;
- The museum response to the legal environment and collecting ethics; and
- Professor Patty Gerstenblith's Keynote address on the adequacy of U.S. law, policy and practice in preventing looting and the international trade of looted objects.
